1. International Trade Law

2. Contract, agreement and MOA formulation

Formal signed agreements or contracts are also useful, and can be essential, for when service problems or failures occur, or for when the customer's or client's requirements change one way or another. Proper contracts and agreements provide an essential reference point upon which to discuss and negotiate effective outcomes whenever situations change, in terms of the client's requirements and the provider's capability. The process of agreeing a contract is therefore, aside from anything else, an excellent way to flush out and make transparent all aspects of the supply or service arrangement, much of which is otherwise commonly 'taken for granted', usually including many wrong or mismatched assumptions on both sides. A good trading contract enables such risks to be averted.

3. Legal Advising and Consultation

Legal advice is the giving of a professional or formal opinion regarding the substance or procedure of the law in relation to a particular factual situation.

Legal advice is ordinarily provided in exchange for financial or other tangible compensation. Advice given without remuneration is normally referred to as being pro bono publico (in the public good), or simply pro bono.

In the common law systems it is usually received from a solicitor, barrister or lawyer; in civil law systems it is given by advocates, lawyers or other professionals (such as tax experts, professional advisors, etc.)
